

Final Instructions


This demonstration charity sprint is organised by Staffordshire Clubs for Young People, registered charity N° 522814. The event is a celebration of motoring and runs will not be timed. As such, the event is not governed by Motorsport UK; nonetheless, these Final Instructions include COVID-19 specific guidelines issued by Motorsport UK and adhered to by the Shenstone & District Car Club.

NB: The event is open to the public this year.

1. The Venue

Curborough Sprint Course is situated 1.5 miles off the A38 at Hilliards Cross (SP Fradley Park), between Burton upon Trent and Lichfield in Staffordshire. The venue is 'brown signed' once you are off the A38, and also from the A515 if approaching from the west.

The course does not have a specific postcode, but you can use the one for the nearest property which is WS13 8EJ. If you are entering an address in your Sat Nav the entrance is in Netherstowe Lane off Wood End Lane.



2. Access

Entrants must print off their own Paddock Pass, if possible in colour, from the link provided in your Joining Instructions. Please check that the Pass corresponds to the vehicle you are bringing. If there is an error, please let us know right away as this will be your Entry Gate Permit.

Please aim to arrive in good time for the Drivers' and Riders' Briefing which is at 9.00am. On arrival you will be given an envelope containing your blue Entrant wristband and your run number, which must be displayed on the front of the vehicle. This envelope will also contain your green Passenger wristband entitlement. By default, there will be one blue and one green wristband per envelope, so please check that you have ordered the correct number of green wristbands if you have more than one passenger.

NB: You will only be permitted to run if your run number is clearly displayed, and your Entrant wristband worn.

NB: You MUST NOT attend if you have any symptoms of Covid-19, or you are required to self-isolate under Government guidelines.

The Paddock

Vehicles will be displayed in year order (and run numbers allocated accordingly). Paddock Marshals will direct you to your parking space. If you have a trailer and support vehicle, please park them on the grass directly behind your allotted space. A separate area of hard standing will be allocated to the motorcycles.

The Paddock will be open from 8.00am to 6.00pm.

Everywhere on site except the track has a speed limit of 10mph.

Paddock Stewards and Track Marshals will control the movement of vehicles in and out of the Paddock and from the Paddock to the start of the Track.

Access to the Paddock is not restricted so vehicles must be left in a safe condition and please do not leave any valuables unattended.

3. Timetable

We have a full entry, so it is critical that we adhere to the timetable to ensure that everyone gets their allotted runs. Please listen for announcements from Paddock Stewards so that you are ready to run at the appropriate time.

Sunday 29th August 2021

17:00 onwards Vehicle / trailer drop off. Overnight camping

Should you wish to drop off a vehicle and/or trailer on Sunday, overnight parking is available, either on the grass opposite the lavatory block by the entrance, or in your allotted space in the Paddock. The gates will be closed overnight - but not locked – please make sure that you close them behind you. David Pattison, Course Manager, can be contacted, if necessary, on 07976 878652. Overnight camping is permitted in the Paddock and *careful* use of barbecues is permitted, i.e. not on the grass.

4. Drivers' and Riders' Briefing

The Drivers' and Riders' Briefing is obligatory and will take place at 9.00am outside the Paddock Office.

NB: You MUST NOT attend if you have any symptoms of Covid-19, or you are required to self-isolate under Government guidelines.

5. Insurance

All Entrants must hold a valid driving licence and ensure that their vehicle is properly maintained in a road-worthy condition and that they have fully comprehensive insurance for their vehicle, driver(s) and passenger(s). Several insurance companies have amended their cover to exclude closed events such as this, even though it is non-competitive. It is your responsibility therefore to ensure that your insurance covers you, your vehicle and all passengers for the event. The Organisers cannot accept responsibility to owners, passengers, or their vehicles on site during the event.

6. Medical and Health

In accordance with the Government's Step 4 relaxation of COVID-19 regulations and in line with Motorsport UK's statement issued on 19th July, spectators are permitted to attend this year. The following standard COVID-19 rules still apply to all attendees, who must be able to answer "No" to the following questions:

- Have you been told to quarantine due to international travel within the last 10 days?
- Have you, or someone you have had close contact with, tested positive for COVID-19 within the last 10 days?
- Have you been advised to self-isolate by NHS Test and Trace?
- Have you experienced any of the following symptoms in the last 10 days: a new continuous cough or high temperature or a loss of, or change in, normal sense of taste or smell (anosmia)?

NB: If the answer to any of the above questions is "Yes" then you must not attend. Please note that all requirements regarding COVID-19 are subject to change at a moment's notice to conform to government and MSUK rules and guidelines in force. Anyone who develops COVID-19 like symptoms during the event must contact the Organisers by phone, before leaving the venue and contacting their doctor or dialling NHS 111.

It is the responsibility of anyone attending the meeting to bring their own face covering and hand sanitiser. An ambulance will be present all day but please bring your own first aid kit to treat any minor injuries.

7. Entrant Contact Number

All Entrants must have a working mobile phone at the event so that they can be contacted. Please ensure that your mobile number is correct on the online registration system.

8. Demonstration Runs

We aim to give each Entrant a maximum of three runs unless unforeseen circumstances do not permit this. This is a non-competitive event; all runs are demonstration only and will not be timed. Passengers are permitted and may feel more comfortable wearing a face mask if they are not from the same household or social bubble. There is no obligation to wear a crash helmet but again please do so if you feel more comfortable.

The maximum noise level allowed is 105db.

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The figure-of-eight course will be used. Once over the finish line, Entrants must slow down as quickly as possible and proceed along the return route back to the Paddock.



While on track all Entrants are under the control of the Track Marshals. Entrants must not start until given a signal by the Track Marshal at the start line. Only one vehicle will be permitted on track at any time. Entrants must drive in a responsible manner. Track Marshals are instructed to flag down anyone who, in their opinion, is travelling at an excessive speed or driving dangerously and anyone doing so will be prevented from completing further runs. If a Track Marshal shows a red flag then the Entrant must slow immediately, return to the Paddock and report to the Paddock Office. If a red flag is waved, the Driver must stop as quickly as possible and not re-start until given permission by a Marshal.

Off track, please note that there is a 10mph speed limit everywhere on site and please heed the Marshals' instructions at all times for the safety of everyone present and to facilitate the smooth running of the event.

9. Static Displays

Pre-booked Static Display vehicles will be guided to the Static Display parking area(s). Eligible vehicles which turn up on the day and pay at the gate may also park in the exhibition area, subject to available space, of course. Unless used as a tow vehicle, all modern vehicles will be directed to the public car park.



We would like to express our gratitude to the Shenstone & District Car Club for permitting us to hold our charity sprint at Curborough again this year. On behalf of the Organisers and Staffordshire Clubs for Young People, it remains for us to wish you a most enjoyable day. The café will be open all day

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and there will be additional food served from 12:00 midday onwards (hog roast, pizzas and fish and chips).

Please note that dogs are permitted but must be kept on a short lead at all times and with owners fully responsible for any cleaning up required.
